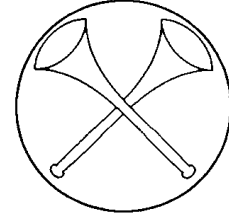

### **Minutes of the April 1, 2012 Meeting**

Meeting commenced at 11:00 AM.

#### **April Submissions**

##### **Bartholomew Scherparowe - New Name**

**Bartholomew** is found on Masculine Given Names Found in the 1296 Lay Subsidy Rolls for Rutland by Karen Larsdatter (Karen Harris) <http://heraldry.sca.org/laurel/names/Rutland/given-masc-alpha.htm> as well as <http://heraldry.sca.org/laurel/names/eng13/eng13m.html> and is a Saint's name, one of Jesus's apostles.

**Scherparowe** is found in R&W pg 403 under the header Sharparrow as in John Scherparowe 1448 used as a nickname for good bowman or maker of arrows.

**Name is approved and forwarded to Laurel.**

---

**Douglas MacKay** – Kingdom Resub Badge: *(Fieldless) A mullet of four greater and four lesser points voided and interlaced per pale sable and azure*

This is a Kingdom return from Dec 2011 for conflict

**Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.**

---

**Fearghus Cochrane** – Laurel Resub Badge: *(Fieldless) a sword inverted winged Or.*

His previous badge, *“(Fieldless) An anchor Or timbered of a wooden stock proper surmounted by a winged escutcheon Or,”* was returned by Laurel with the following comment:

While we do not protect specific modern military insignia, commenters were unanimous in their opinion that this submission is overly allusive to modern military insignia in general and is not medieval heraldry. Therefore, this badge is returned for violating section VII.4 of the Rules for Submissions, which says that "Armory may not use obtrusively modern designs."

This badge is a complete redesign.

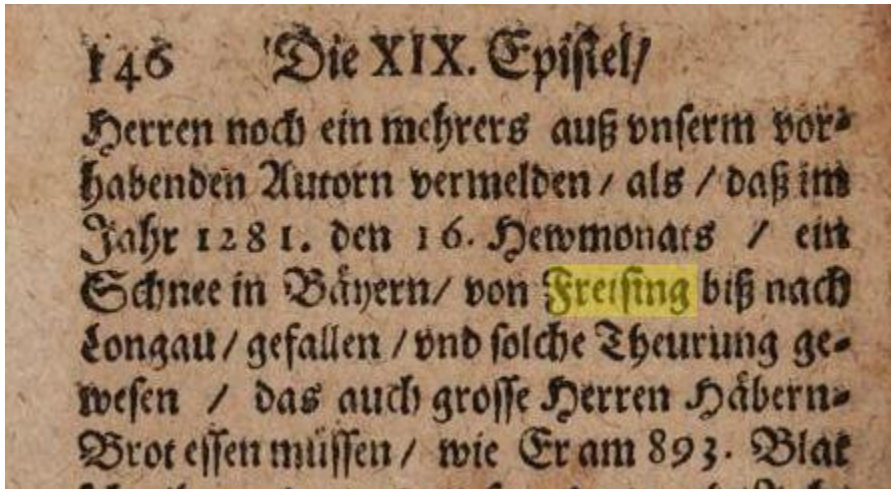
**Hroudland von Freising** - New Name & New Device: *Per chevron sable and Or, two crosses formy and an eagle counterchanged*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

Culture (German late 11th early 12th century) most important.

**Hroudland** is found in Brechenmacher, vol. 2, p. 425, s.n. Roland, with the following statement: “Der Held von Roncesvalles heißt bei Einhard Hroudland.” It is also found in Bahlow pg 420 s.n. Roland. Einhard [Charlemagne's biographer] spelled the name Hroudland as the individual in the Song of Roland.

**von Freising:** Otto von Freising or Otto Frisingensis (c. 1114 – 22 September 1158 was a German bishop and chronicler. Most references are in Latin. We did find an example of *von Freising* in a book published in 1644 (<http://books.google.com/books?ei=bch4T73ZGMmhiQL5kNmnDg&id=581FJtCzhhIC>, p. 146).



The device conflicts with Dietrick von Tyrol, *Per chevron sable and Or, two lions couchant respectant and an eagle displayed counterchanged*, with only one CD for changes to half the charges.

**Name approved and forwarded to Laurel. Device returned for conflict.**

**Johan von Kohlstädt** - New Name

**Johan** is found as a variation of Johannes in German Names from Nürnberg, 1497 Aryanhwy merch Catmael and 15th German Names from Mecklenburg: Hans by Aryanhwy merch Catmael <http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/german/hans-m.html> Johan Prutz 1453

**von Kohlstädt** is a undated town in Gentry pg 307; kohl is cabbage or dark and städt is town. Numerous other towns with Kohl including Kohlschreiber in Olmutz 1420, Kohlhunt 1398 and Kohlhopf 1175, same page in Gentry. Though we were unable to find dated spellings, we believe that this to be a period spelling based on other Kohl-based placenames, and request the assistance of the College of Arms in documenting the submitter's desired spelling.

**Ponç lo Bonòme** - New Badge: *(Fieldless) A goute paly gules and Or*

The goute needs more divisions in order to appear as paly. The depiction here is “on a goute gules a pale Or.”

**Badge returned for redraw.**

---

**Ponç lo Bonòme** - New Badge: *(Fieldless) On a key cross Or a cross clechy sable*

Under the current rules, this badge likely conflicts with the Counts of Toulouse, *Gules, a cross of Toulouse Or*, if one considers a cross of Toulouse as a key cross charged with a cross clechy with the same tincture as the field. Under that interpretation there would be a single CD for fieldlessness. Under the new rules, which should be in place by the time this is considered, there will be a DC for changing the tincture of the cross clechy. We will hold this until a decision is made on the new rules at the April 28<sup>th</sup> BoD meeting.

---

**Rois Patten** - New Name & New Device: *Argent, a brown rabbit statant proper and on a chief sable two compass stars argent*

**Róis** is found in St Gabriel Report 2704 as an Irish feminine name used in the 16th century in Ulster: "The root name <Ro/is> was used in Ulster in the 16th century, [1, 2, 3]." The relevant references are:

**Patten** is found as a surname in Reaney & Wilson pg 341 and is the header spelling, dated 1390.

This name combines Gaelic and English and is a SFPP. The given name was submitted without an accent mark. As accents can be dropped, so long as they are dropped consistently, we have not changed the submitted name.

The Pictorial Dictionary states "Rabbits and hares are sejant by default, though in period that posture was often drawn so low as to be indistinguishable from statant." This depiction closely matches that in the Pictorial Dictionary, which is blazoned "statant." In the SCA, we would expect sejant to be closer to the depiction submitted by Alena Alekseevna: <https://oscar.sca.org/emblazons/Caid/2012-01/Alena%20c.jpg>.

The use of compass star is a step from period practice.

**Sō Rokurō Yoriaki** - New Device: *Sable, in cross four mascles within an orle argent*

The submitter's name was registered January 2012. He has permission to conflict with Sō Haruko's device *Sable, in cross four mascles within an annulet argent*.

**Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.**

**Tatiana Dragon** - New Device: *Gules, in saltire a threaded needle and a spoon argent*

We believe this to be clear of Cerdic Cenfrithsson (badge, 08/2008, Outlands), *Gules, an eating fork bendwise sinister argent*, with a CD for the difference between a spoon and a fork and another for the addition of the needle.

**Tristan Everhart** – Kingdom Resub Device: *Per pale purple goutty argent and sable, a polar bear rampant and a tower, a base wavy argent*

The previous submission, *Argent, on a pale purple between two towers sable a dragon rampant maintaining in its mouth a rose argent*, was returned at the November 2010 CoH meeting for a redraw.
