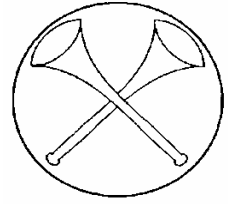

### *Minutes of the May 15, 2016 Meeting*

Meeting commenced at 11:00 AM.

#### **From Crescent:**

- I (along with several other Caidan Heraldry) attended KWHSS in Salt Lake City. Next years will be in Knoxville, Tennessee, Shire of Nant Y Derwyddon. Many excellent classes were taught and taken.
- An alpha version of Electronic Submissions program built by Istvan *Non Scripta*. It is first being built for heralds, not submitters. If you are interested in alpha testing it, talk to me.
- Great Laurel Archiving Project is now complete; paper files are destroyed. The Laurel staff is now reorganizing and building a digital archive. The eventual goal is to have an online archive with auto-redaction of forms, tied to O and A. (This is a long way off yet.)
- Related to this, the College of Arms IT needs more resources and space on the SCA server. The Board is likely to ask the College to pick up the cost of this, so prices are likely to increase by \$1. Caid will not be increasing their rates to match, and will absorb the additional cost.
- Ursula Georges was announced as the new Palimpsest Herald, replacing Marie de Blois.
- June meeting – Queen's Champion Equestrian has moved to June 5 in Calafia. Looking to reschedule our own meeting to June 12. There will be Brewers' Guild meeting at the house on the same day, so we will do a joint Heraldry and Brewers potluck. Bring chairs.

#### **From Battlement:**

- Tomuki, Steward of GWW, asked for budget for Heraldry Activities. Ardgall and I provided exchequer budget of costs for past few years. Main cost is for printing and toner, as well as WiFi. Runs (including donations and available materials) about \$200, but starting from scratch would be about \$350.

**Alana Hostilius** - New Name and New Device: *Argent, on a pale between two lightning bolts azure, a caucasian angel proper winged Or.*

Submitted as *Alana Hostilia*, corrected to match her father's registered name.

**Alana** has been found in period by Tangwystyl verch Morgant Glasvryn cited (1381) [Robertus Filius Radulf] and [Alana filia eius]. This citation is from Fenwick, Carolyn C, Poll Taxes of 1377, 1379 and 1381, Part 1: Bedfordshire- Lincestershire p 112.'

**Hostilius**: being used as a cognomen, is a roman Nomen, found <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/roman.html>, A Simple Guide to Imperial Roman Names by Ursula Georges, this name is her fathers name Alexander Hostilius of Caid, registered Caid 4/2014, she has inherited this cognomen from her father. Relationship attested by Dolphin and Elizabeth *Beau Coeur*.

**Angus Ian Macgregor** - New Name.

Submitter desires a masculine name. If the name must be changed, submitter cares most about the surname. If the initial "G" in Macgregor can be capitalized, the submitter would prefer it, but does not require it.

**Angus** is a late-period English given name found at <https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:J85R-WNY>, Batch #B39474-6 : Angus Towlye, m, 29 Jan 1609, Coningsby, Lincoln, England.

**Ian** is a late-period English given name found at <https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:NVTY-232>, Batch #M06080-1 : Ian Moore, m, 27 Nov 1608, Leconfield, York, England.  
Double given names are an accepted practice in late-period England.

**MacGregor** is found as a Scottish family name. It is listed in Black dated to 1603, on page 505. "MacGregor son of Gregory" Gregor is found as a personal masculine name in Black page 327. "Robert son of Gregor" witnessed a deed around 1240 Mac is the Scottish Patronymic marker. <Denesoun M'Gregor> appears in Black s.n. Denson dated to 1589. The M' is a scribal abbreviation which must be expanded to Mac- for registration.

**Aquillia Verecunda** - New Name & New Device *Argent, a pair of wings azure conjoined in base to a crescent pendant sable.*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

Culture (Must be Roman) most important.

Submitted with the blazon *Argent, a crescent pendant sable winged azure* we have modified it to represent the wings as primary and the crescent as secondary.

The naming pattern of <female nomen> + <female cognomen> is stated in Ursula Georges article linked above

**Borggeir járnsiða** - New Name & New Device: *Quarterly purple and sable, a tower Or and overall two halberds in saltire argent.*

**Borggeir** is found on the Viking Answer Lady site as a male given name

The first element Borg- is an alternate form of Berg-, thus derived from the OW.Norse verb bjarga "to save, to help." Borg- is sometimes assumed to be derived from OW.Norse borg "castle, fortified place". For the second element -geirr see above. Runic examples include the accusative case forms borkeR, burkaiR, geirr is identical with Old Icelandic geirr, "spear" [burkeR]. FJ pp. 343 s.n. -geirr; CV p. 196 s.v. geirr; NR s.nn. BorggæiRR, Borg-, -gæiRR

**járnsiða** is a Norse byname meaning iron-side found in Viking Bynames found in the Landnámabók by Aryanhwy merch Catmael (Sara L. Uckelman) 1999

"járnsiðr" is attested in Geirr Bassi, page 24 as a byname meaning "iron side".

Heralds at the meeting had a difficult time identifying the heads of the poleaxes. A redraw completed at the meeting was approved in email by the submitter.

**Calafia, Barony of** - New Appeal of Laurel Return of Badge. *Azure, a sea serpent ondoyant-emergent sable fimbriated and overall a trident Or.*

In Aug of 1979 the Baronial device with the required Laurel wreath was registered and the former non laurel wreath version should have been retained as historic arms or badge. I am not sure if this is an administrative only submission or other.

The Baronial device is *Azure, a sea serpent ondoyant-emergent sable, fimbriated Or, overall a trident with a laurel wreath entwined in its tines Or.*

The Caid College of Heraldry supports the Barony's petition to restore their ancient arms, which appear to have been dropped in error during Heraldrycon.

**Calafia, Barony of** - New Badge. *Per fess sable and azure, a trident head fesswise Or.*

The barony intends for this badge to be used for the Flagship of Calafia, an unofficial recognition of a nautical household, awarded at Potrero War annually.

**Claudia Prima** - New Device Change. *Gules, three amphorae Or.*

Old Item: *Per pale azure and Or, a fleur-de-lys and a bordure counterchanged.*, to be retained as a badge.

**Claudius of Jericho**- New Name and New Device. *Azure, a hyena salient Or marked sable atop a base argent masoned sable, in sinister canton a decrescent argent.*

Submitter has indicated no preferences.

**Claudius** is found in A Simple Guide to Imperial Roman Names by Ursula Georges under Nomens.

Submitter's original artwork blurred the line between salient and courant, with the body approximately 20-30 degrees from the horizon. Redrawn at the meeting and approved by submitter.

**Edward the Pink** - New Name & New Device. *Per chevron argent ermined gules and gules ermined argent.*

Submitter provides no preferences.

**Edward** is a masculine English given name found in Withycombe s.n. Edward as Edwardus (1206) as well as in patronymics William Edward' (1219) and Cristina Edwardis (1279). Edwardus also appears as a Latinized form in "14th Century Worcestershire Masculine Names" by Aryanhwy merch Catmael (<http://heraldry.sca.org/names/english/mascworc14.html>).

**the Pink** is the *lingua Anglica* form of the English descriptive byname *le Pynch*, found in R&W, sn. Pink, Pinck, Pinks, Pinch as *Lucia le Pynch* and *Dionisia le Pinch*, both dated 1317. (Also Adam Pinc 1176, Hugo Pinch 1190, Robert and Henry Pinke 1200). R&W notes that the byname comes from OE "pinca" or "pinc", meaning a chaffinch, also modernly called a "pink." The OED says (s.n. Pink sb.6) "Pink: An imitation of the note of the chaffinch (often reduplicated pink-pink); hence *transf.*, a local name for the bird itself."

Submitter is advised to draw fewer, larger ermine spots.

**Elske le Dragon** - New Name & New Device. *Vert, two dragons sejant erect respectant tails entwined and on a chief argent four hearts vert.*

**Elske** is a female Dutch given name. Found in Acta Historiae Neerlandicae/Studies on the History of the Netherlands VI By W. Brulez, A. C. F. Koch, E. H. Kossman, F. C. Spits, Joh. de Vries, P. L. Geschiere, Alice. C. Carter, J. Dhondt pg65 entry 139 Elske Assing married feb 20 1566/67 Marcarius Pinnick-G.R.

**Le Dragon** is an English byname found in Reaney and Wilson Sn. Dragon Walter Dragon 1221, Le Dragon 1275

Dutch and English is an approved combination per Appendix A.

The submitted emblazon has the dragons pushed heavily to chief, enough that commenters had a problem deciding whether they were supposed to be "in chief" or not, given the existence of the chief. A redraw completed at the heralds meeting was approved by the submitter.

**Gríma kǫttr** - New Name.

Submitter wants a feminine name. If the name must be changed, submitter cares most about the meaning, "Cat."

**Gríma** is found as a feminine Norse name in Geirr Bassi pg 10.

**kǫttr** is a descriptive byname meaning "cat" found at p. 25 of Geirr Bassi.

The form was changed to add the accent mark on the i before the paperwork was received at the meeting.

**Hannah of Nordwache** - New Alternate Name. *Hannah Sigriðardottir.*

Submitted as *Hannah Sigridrdottir*, the name was modified for proper matronymic structure with her mother's registered name spelling.

Submitter desires a feminine name and indicates no other preferences.

**Hannah** is already registered to the submitter as Hannah of Nordwache.

**Sigriðr**: Submitter's mother is Sigríðr hvíta refr, registered January 2013. (Attested by Estrith - Dolphin and Lizzie - Beau Coeur.) Sigriðr is a Norse name pg 14 in Geirr Bassi,

**Dottir**: means daughter of

**Heinrich Augustein von Helden** - New Badge: *(Fieldless) A ram's skull affronty vert.*

This badge conflicts with Pelleas of Crete: *Erminois, a ram's head cabossed vert.* (June 2014, via Atenveldt). There is a DC for being fieldless. However, the change from a head to a skull does not provide the second DC. Per the Precedents of Elisabeth de Rossignol: "... there is not a CD between a ram's head and a ram's skull ... [Cormacc ua Néill, 08/2007, R-An Tir]

No payment was received at the kingdom level.

**Jordan of Nordwache** - New Alternate Name. *Jordan Sigriðardottir*

Submitted as a Jordan Sigridrdottir, name was modified to for proper matronymic structure with her mother's registered name spelling.

Submitter desires a feminine name and indicates no other preferences.

**Jordan** is already registered to the submitter as Jordan of Nordwache.

**Sigriðr**: Jordan is the daughter of Sigríðr hvíta refr, registered January 2013. (Attested by Estrith - Dolphin and Lizzie - Beau Coeur.) Sigriðr is a Norse name pg 14 in Geirr Bassi,

**Joshua al-Tabrizi** - New Name & New Device *Purple, a dragon sejant between in cross four mullets of eight points Or*

**Joshua** is a male Hebrew given name that appears in Jewish Names in the World of Medieval Islam, compiled by ehoshua ben Haim haYerushalmi and Juliana de Luna.

[http://heraldry.sca.org/names/Jewish/Cairo/cairo\\_men.html](http://heraldry.sca.org/names/Jewish/Cairo/cairo_men.html) Appearing in the lists of Jewish men's names are many classical Arabic names without any specifically Hebrew forms. These names take

several forms. There are a number of names that are specifically devotional names such as Hibat Alla-h or 'Abd al-'Aziz `servant of the Omnipotent'. These names are uniquely Arabic forms. However, they have a linguistic parallel in Jewish names like Joshua or Hillel which while not a direct cognate also derive from linguistic roots that relate to praising G-d. There are a large number of other classical Arabic names that appear among the Jews of Cairo including Ghulayb, Hasan, Huysayn, Muhammad and others. Some of these names come from the Koran or other traditional Arabic sources. In addition, some men appear to be known simply by a relationship. There are a number of men who are simply known as the father of their son Abu Sahl or Abu Ibrahim or by a patronymic such as Ibn Hiba or Ibn Walid. Some of these forms show a man as the father of a quality or trait and not a literal son such as Abu Tayyib father of the good. "

**al-** is an Arabic and Persian term for 'of'

**Tabrizi** is an Arabic and Persian locative form of the place name 'Tabriz'. Private correspondence from Ursula Georges (attached) indicates that Tabrizi is the Persian locative form of the town Tabriz. Ursula notes that Persian locatives don't distinguish between masculine and feminine bynames of this type.

**Liam Makfersan** - New Badge (*Fieldless*) *A rabbit rampant gules holding in its dexter paw a lantern Or.*

**Magnus Black** - New Name and New Device *Argent, a wolf rampant vert and a bordure vert semy of "beamed" musical notes argent.*

**Magnus** is a male Scottish given name, found in Index of Scots names found in Dictionary of the Older Scottish Tongue, by Sara L. Uckelman on <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/resources/scots/aelic.html>.

**Black** is a byname found <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/resources/scots/aelic.html>

The name conflicts with Magnus the Black, registered March 1998 via Meridies. The article *the* is excluded from the changes that count for difference between names, per SENA PN3.c.2.

While musical notes have been documented to period, and thus are permitted as SCA charges, beamed notes have not been documented. We will need such documentation before they can be registered. Assuming these issues are addressed, no conflict was found.

English and French name elements can be mixed per SENA Appendix C.

**Matsudaira Omiyame** - New Name & New Device. *Per pale wavy purple and Or, an ounce and a dragon combattant counterchanged.*

Sound (unspecified) most important.

**Matsudaira** is a Japanese surname dated to 1572, found in Name Construction in Medieval Japan, revised edition, by Solveig Thronardottir, Potboiler Press, Columbia, MO, 2004, page 110

**Omiyame** is a Japanese given name dated to 784, found in Name Construction in Medieval Japan, revised edition, by Solveig Thronardottir, Potboiler Press, Columbia, MO, 2004, page 102

Precedent specifies that if sources only give the first instance of a name, we give the submitter the benefit of the doubt for temporal proximity (Aleksei Vasilev – 10/2015) so we have forwarded this to Laurel.

**Séamus mac Néill Uí Conchobhairr** - New Name & New Device. *Vert, on a pale between four tankards Or, an Anglo-Saxon lyre vert.*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

Language (Late period Irish Gaelic) most important.

Culture (Late period Irish Gaelic) most important.

All name construction and documentation comes from web pages linked by the Academy of St. Gabriel Name construction uses the pattern of <given name> mac <father's name> Uí <clan ancestor's name> found in "Quick and Easy Gaelic Names" by Effrick (Sharon Krossa)

The name elements are all found in "Index of Names in Irish Annals" by Mari Elspeth nic Bryan (Kathleen M. O'Brien) at <http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/>

Séamus is a male Irish given name documented 14 times between 1398 and 1608. This is the Early Modern Irish Gaelic nominative form of the name.

Néill is the genitive form of Niall, a male Irish given name documented 23 times between 971 and 1611. This is both the Middle Irish and Early Modern Irish form.

Ua Conchobhair, Ó Conchobhair is an Irish clanfamily name documented 48 times between 1019 and 1583. Uí Chonchobhair is the Early Modern Irish Gaelic genitive

form. ([http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/FamilyNames/O\\_Conchobhair.shtml](http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/FamilyNames/O_Conchobhair.shtml)). While the clan ancestor's name needs to be lenited, which the form Uí Chonchobhair appears to be), the raw data seems to support the submitted spelling: Serlus mac Cathail Gaill Uí Conchobhair (M1235.5), Uí Conchobhair with Aodh mac Ruaidhri mic Briain Uí Conchobhair (M1487.7), and Tadhcc Ruadh mac Cairpre Uí Conchobhair (M1497.23). In fact the same Annal (C) shows both Chon- and Con- with Tuathal mac Muirceartaigh Uí Chonchobhair and Tadhg mac Tuathail mic Muircertaigh Muimhnigh Uí Conchobhair.
