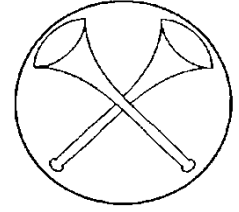


Caidan College of Heraldry

**Amber Dragon Wyck** (Wintermist) - New Name & New Device. *Per pale gules and argent, a chevron between a decrescent, an increscent, and a dragon dormant contourny, all counterchanged.*

Submitter desires a feminine name and will accept no major changes.

**Amber** is a late period English surname.

**Dragon** is a late period English surname.

**Wyck** is found as a late and grey period surname in England on familysearch

Jane Wyck Female Christening 14 Dec 1578 Linstead, Kent, England Father's Name

This name is an English surname used as a given name with 2 additional surnames as allowed in SENA.

**Botsta 'd' Bazuraad** (Calafia) - New Name & New Device. *Azure, two ravens respectant and a wagon wheel Or.*

No preferences marked

No documentation for the name was provided, nor was the College been able to find any.

**Brian of Garfield** (Calafia) - New Name.

No preferences marked.

All name elements are found in FamilySearch Historical Records.

Garford, Garforth, and Gargrave are all found in Mills with Gar as a triangular piece of land, so Garfield seems a reasonable constructed locative.

Note: His legal name is Brian Scott Garfield, which is why "of" is imperative.

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**Bruce MacDonald** (Calafia) - New Name & New Device. *Per pale sable and vert, on a chief argent a wolf courant contourny sable.*

No preferences marked.

Bruce is a saint's name. The Middle English Dictionary s.v. lūt(e) (n.(1)) dates the following quote to 1445: "For þis holy daunce, mynstralcy ys goode: Now, Seynt Bruce! helpe with þy sounded lute."

Bruce is also found on family search Bruce Skott, buried 1591, Lincoln, batch B02594-3

MacDonald: is found in Family Search Historical Records: Margaret Mcdonald, female, christened3 Jun 1613 in Edinburgh, Midlothian, Scotland, #C11999-1

Mcdonald is a scribal abbreviation of MacDonald

This name is not a conflict with Elizabeth Bruce MacDonald, which was changed and released in August of 1990.

This device is clear of Donovan Schinnock, March 2008, Per pale sable and vert, on a chief argent a wolf passant gules, with one DC for color of the wolf and another for orientation.

**Eibhlin an Ucaire** (Calafia) - Laurel Resub Badge. *(Fieldless) A sword inverted proper between and maintained by two dragons combatant sable and gules.*

From Dec 2015 LoAR:

**Eibhlin an Ucaire.** Badge. *(Fieldless) A sword inverted proper between and grasped by two dragons combatant sable and gules.*

This badge is returned for redraw, for violating SENA A2C2 which states "Elements must be drawn to be identifiable." Many commenters had trouble identifying the dragons and perceived the design as a bat winged sword.

This redraw addresses the reason for return.

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**Hette Vitze** (Isles) - New Badge. *(Fieldless) A fireball saltirewise purpure enflamed proper, overall in cross four furisons conjoined flats to center argent.*

The submitter has registered both: (Fieldless) A fireball saltirewise purpure enflamed proper, and (Fieldless) In cross four furisons conjoined, flats to center argent.

We do not know if there is a precedent or period evidence for an overall charge to not be a single charge, but rather multiple conjoined charges. Although there was some concern about the identifiability of the charges, and the amount of 'overall-ness' we are sending this up for a determination.

---

**Isela of Silvercreek** (Wintermist) – Kingdom Resub Device. *Lozengy purpure and Or, a brown rabbit proper and a rabbit argent combattant.*

While not the typical verbage, this blazon is more clear.

Submitter's previous submission was returned by the kingdom for redraw due to the lack of identifiability of the rabbits. This submission resolves that issue.

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**Joshua of Calafia** (Calafia) - Kingdom Resub Device. *Vert, a wolf rampant Or and a bordure embattled argent.*

This is a kingdom resub (originally was paid but no forms received).

**Michael de Connacht** (Calafia) - New Name & New Device. *Argent, a chevron between three escallops inverted sable and a bordure per fess gules and sable.*

no boxes marked, the submitting herald notes: submitter allows the change of de to other adjective if required to register

**Michael** is found as an English masculine given name in Withycombe dated from 1196.

**de Connacht** is an anglicized Irish locative byname Names Found in Anglicized Irish Documents by Mari ingen Briain meic Donnchada (Kathleen M. O'Brien)© 2000-2010 by Kathleen M. O'Brien. Version 2.2, updated 07 April 2010(<http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnglicizedIrish/>)

## Cultures

The people who appear in these records come from several different cultures.

Many are of Gaelic descent, though it is impossible to tell for certain which spoke English as their primary (or only) language and which spoke Irish Gaelic as their primary (or only) language.

Others are descended from Anglo-Norman families who arrived in the late 12th century or soon thereafter. By the 16th century, these families had evolved into a culture that was not Gaelic but also was not English. Some of this phenomenon was due to simple cultural interaction that they had with both Irish Gaels and with the English. However, a good bit of the creation of the formation of this separate culture was due to intentional influence by England in many forms including, but not limited to, the Statutes of Kilkenny. That descendants of these families were viewed as "not English" by natives of England can be seen in Campion (c. 1571), pp. 5 - 8, which includes such colorful descriptions as:

Lord Bermingham, Baron of Athenrye, now degenerate and become meere Irish, against whome his auncestors served valiantly in An. 1300.

Mac Suretan Lord Deseret, whom Sir Henry Sidney called Iordan de Exeter. This was Lord in the time of Lionell Duke of Clarence, An. 1361. now very wilde Irish.

Mac William Burcke, Lord of eighter Connacht, now very Irish.

Seintleger, Baronet of Slemarge, meere Irish.

Den, Baronet of Por man ston, waxing Irish.

We are requesting help with documentation for this name if the provided is not sufficient.

The escallops would be more identifiable with white detailing on the color emblazon, the lines are clearly visible on the black and white version.

**Michael de Connacht** (Calafia) - New Badge. (*Fieldless*) *an escallop inverted sable.*

This conflicts with Ceridwen de Bellême (*Fieldless*) *An escallop inverted sable* (April of 1992, Atenveldt).

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**Randulf Greenwall** (Starkhafn) - New Name Change.

Old Item: *Randolph Greenwall* to be released.

**Randulf** is an English masculine given name found in FamilySearch Historical Records, including:

**Greenwall** is an English surname found in FamilySearch Historical Records, including:

Greenwall is also grandfathered to the submitter.

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**Sigarr bassi** (Calafia) - New Name.  
No boxed are marked.

**Sigarr** is found in Geir bassi pg 14 with 1 example as a given name.

**bassi** is listed as a nickname also in Gb on pg 19 meaning great bear-like person.

While this is technically clear of Geirr Bassi, there was discussion about the similarity (and the evocative).

---

**Tryggr járngeirr Ingvarsson** (Calafia) - Kingdom Resub Device. *Quarterly vert and gules, a pike embowed counterchanged per pale Or and argent, in base two spears in chevron inverted Or, bladed argent.*

This is a Kingdom resub from August 2015.

We are not sure about the unity of posture issue, but are sending this up pending clarification.

**Wilim Stokesay** (Calafia) - New Name & New Device. *Or, on a chevron cotised between three ravens sable two plates.*

no boxes marked, if the e needs to be dropped to register Stokesay the submitter is ok with the change

**Wilim** is found as a given name at familysearch.org:

**Stokesay** is the header spelling in Ekwall pg 446. Dated spellings include Stoksay 1256. The manor was held by Hugh de Sei in 1195. Originally Stoke. Adding the e is a plausible spelling for a later period.

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**Zosime Pompeiana** (Angels) – Kingdom Resub Device. *Per pale vert and sable, an amphora and on a chief argent and arrow reversed sable.*

Kingdom Resub from Oct. 2016 for conflict. This redesign clears the previous conflict.
