

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Minutes of the January 22, 2017 Meeting

Meeting commenced at 11:00 AM.

In attendance were: Paul *Crescent*, Jeanne Marie *Blue Mountain*, Ariana *Trident*, Arianna *Seraph*, Damian *Sable Fret*, Illuminada *Chanson*, Brianna Je Nell *Golden Rose*. Attending remotely was Cormac *Beare* and Angharat Goch verch Gwenhover.

Meeting schedule for 2016/2017: Mar 5, Apr 9, May 14, June 11 at Collegium, July 9, Aug 20, Sept 10, Oct 15, Nov 19, Dec 3.

Approved submissions were forwarded to Laurel on the January 31, 2016 Letter of Intent.

From Crescent:

- Many thanks to John ap Griffin, who stepped down as *Seraph* at Queen's Champion after many years of faithful service. Thanks are also due to his successor as *Seraph*, Arianna Foxford.
- Appreciations are also due to Brianna Je Nell Aislynn of Blue Shadows, who stepped down as *Courtesy* at Coronation. She will keep busy as the new *Golden Rose* for this reign. Her successor as *Courtesy* is Cormac Mór.
- Keeping with the officer succession theme: Two of my senior deputies, Mealla *Bellows* and Estrith *Dolphin* are nearing the end of their terms of office and, as result, are looking for successors. The usual term for both offices is two years, with the possibility of extension for an additional year. Applications for both positions are due to me by March 1, and decisions will be made by April 1. Descriptions of both offices and transition timelines follow.

From The Boke of Caidan Law, the Bellows herald, in charge of field heraldry [is] responsible for:

- (a) Coordinating all field heraldry and any additional heraldic services (such as, but not limited to, making announcements, consultation tables and heraldic contests) at Crown Tournaments (Armored), Queen's Champion Tournament (Armored and Rapier), and other events as prescribed by Caidan custom and/or the Crown;
- (b) Recruiting and supervising the training of new field heralds.
- (c) Other tasks or duties as specified by the Crescent Herald.

Mealla has expanded on legally required aspects of the role by ensuring that field heraldry happens at all of the QC lists (not just armored and rapier). She has also followed the recent tradition of Bellows acting as the back of court for Coronation; this is not required, but holders of this office have seemed to enjoy doing it.

To enable a smooth transition, Mealla would like to have her successor shadow her at Spring Crown (April 29th, in the Shire of the Isles) and at Summer Coronation and Queen's Champion (July 15-16) to get a feel for the job, with the formal handover occurring a convenient event soon after.

From The Boke of Caidan Law, the Dolphin herald, in charge of submissions [is] responsible for:

- (a) Presiding over monthly meetings of the Kingdom College of Heralds;
- (b) Submitting Letters of Intent to the Corporate College of Arms and contacting submitters with the results of these actions in a timely fashion;
- (c) Promoting heraldic commentary to the Corporate College of Arms, on submissions from Caid and other kingdoms;
- (d) Recruiting and supervising the training of new administrative heralds.
- (e) Other tasks or duties as specified by the Crescent Herald.

The primary responsibility of this role is acting as Kingdom Submissions Herald, and, as such, a familiarity with the operations of the Society's College of Arms, a working knowledge of the Standards for Evaluation of Names and Armory (SENA), and – above all – excellent written communication skills and an eye for detail are critical to the job.

Estrith would like to begin the transition process in April/May, with formally handover of the office happening at Collegium (June 11th).

January Submissions

Albra Katerine Marie Isabelle Bautiste (Darach) - New Badge. (Fieldless) A moon in her plenitude per pale purpure and argent.

The badge incorporates a charge and tinctures found in the submitter's device, registered March 1982.

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Dreiburgen, Barony of - New Badge Association. *Argent, on a pile inverted throughout azure a tower argent, within a bordure embattled azure.*

This submission is to be associated with populace.

The badge was registered in March 1982 and reblazoned in September 1982. The attached letter states:

We, Logan Black Rune and Tyne MacPhersone, Baron and Baroness of Dreiburgen, do request that the badge Argent, on a pile inverted throughout azure a tower argent, within a bordure embattled azure, be designated as our populace badge. Done by our hand this 19th day of January AS 51 and 2017 by the common reckoning.

It is signed by the Baron, Baroness, and *Blue Mountain* with both SCA and legal names.

Badge association approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Dreiburgen, Barony of - New Badge Association. *Argent, on a pile inverted throughout azure an escutcheon argent, a bordure embattled azure.*

This submission is to be associated with *Defenders of the Three Towers of Dreiburgen, Order of the* The badge and order name were both registered in April 2005. The attached letter states:

We, Logan Black Rune and Tyne MacPhersone, Baron and Baroness of Dreiburgen, do request that the badge *Argent, on a pile inverted throughout azure an escutcheon argent, a bordure embattled azure*, be designated as the badge for the *Order of the Defenders of the Three Towers of Dreiburgen*. Done by our hand this 19th day of January AS 51 and 2017 by the common reckoning.

It is signed by the Baron, Baroness, and *Blue Mountain* with both SCA and legal names.

The association was noted on the LoI (Dec. 2004) but not on the LoAR. As other letters were being signed at the same time, this seemed the easiest fix as it confirms that the barony still intends for the badge to be associated with the order, rather than submitting it as an errata.

Badge association approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Kendrick le Peste (Dreiburgen) – Kingdom Resub Device. *Or, an eagle sable within a bordere azure semy-delys argent.*

The submitter's previous device *Or*, an eagle sable on a chief azure three fleurs de lis argent was returned by the Caid College of Heralds at their October 2016 meeting for conflict with *Or*, a raven displayed sable and on a chief azure three wolves passant argent (Alicia FitzHugh of Ravensworth, January 2001, An Tir). This redesign clears that conflict.

The original form was printed on a color printer. There was questions on whether the bordure was *purpure* or *azure*. The form was recolored with the submitter's permission to make it clear that the bordure is *azure*.

Device approved and forward to Laurel.

Magdalena Szabados (Calafia) – Kingdom Resub Name & Kingdom Resub Device. *Vert, on a pale wavy between two towers argent three tulips gules slipped and leaved vert.*

The submitter's previous name *Magdalena Szabadics* was returned by the Caid College of Heralds at their September 2016 for lack of documentation. The submitter's device of the same blazon was returned at the same meeting for lack of a name and for lack of identifiability.

Magdalena is a German feminine given name found in "German Names from 1495" at http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/german/german1495.html with 8 occurrences in this spelling.

Kolosvari Arpadne Julia provided the Caid College of Heralds with the following information regarding Hungarian name sources and the byname **Szabados**:

Kázmér and Szamota/Zolnay focus specifically on Hungarian names and words, and Fehértói is mostly single-element names recorded in Latin context. However, it looks to me like the Slavic name was probably based on a Hungarian one: _szabad_ means (and meant) 'free', and is at the root of several surnames. From Kázmér: >> Szabad 1488: Zabad -0-, 1499: Georgius Zabad, c. 1638: Zabad Jmre. < szabad 'szabados' (which see). M: societal rank. Compare Jobbágy, Nemes, Paraszt, Polgár, Pór,

Rabatos, Úr, Zsellér. >> Szabadi 1578: R. Gregorii Zabadÿ, 1603: Thomas [Szabadi], 1613: Stephanus Zabady, 1627: Joannem Szabady. < _szabadi_ < _Szabad_ placename (Marosszék) + -i adjectival suffix / _Szabadi_ placename (Győr, Somogy, Veszprém counties). M: place of origin. >> Szabados 1469

As we do not have a copy of this source, we ask the assistance of the College of Arms in confirming the documentation.

SENA Appendix C notes that Hungarian/Romanian and German name elements are compatible, provided that they are documented to within 300 years of each other.

Molly of the Crossroads (Calafia) – Laurel Resub Device. Per pale argent and azure, a Latin cross flory between four harps counterchanged.
The submitter's previous device of the same submission was returned by Laurel on the Oct 2016 LoAR because of a miscommunication about the permission to conflict letter. This resubmission addresses the reason for return
I,, known in the SCA as Aaliz de Gant, give, known in the SCA as Molly of the Crossroads, permission for her armory Per pale argent and azure, a latin cross flory between four harps counterchanged to look similar to, but not identical to, my armory, Per pale argent and azure, a cross flory between four fleurs-de-lys counterchanged.

Nicholas Alexander Wolfe de Woodchurch (Gyldenholt) – New Name & New Device. *Vert, a wolf rampant and on a chief argent, two ravens adorsed sable*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Language (English) most important.

Culture (English) most important.

Appearing in internal commentary as Nicholas Wolfe, the name was changed by the submitter to avoid conflict.

Nicholas is a header in Withycombe (pp. 227-8), with this spelling dated to 1273. It's also found in Mari Elspeth nic Bryan: "An Index to the 1332 Lay Subsidy Rolls for Lincolnshire, England" (http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/mari/LincLSR/) as one of the most popular masculine names.

Alexander is an English masculine given name found in "English Names found in Brass Enscriptions" by Julian Goodwyn (http://heraldry.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/brasses/men.html) dated to 1388.

Wolfe is an English surname from Black (p. 822, s.n. Wolf). which shows that Robert Wolfe served on a jury in Swinton, Lancashire, in 1408.

Woodchurch is an English placename found in Ekwall as the header spelling pg 530 meaning 'wooden church" Chs [Wodechirche c1100, Odecere c1150 Chester], W~K [Wudecirce 11DM, chirch 1240 Ass]. The Caid College of Heralds was unable to find documentation of this spelling as a placename in period. However, FamilySearch Historical Records include:

Marie Woodchurch, married 16 July 1616, Sussex, England; Batch M02528-4 (https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:NK3N-1M3)

This has the appearance of an unmarked locative (which SENA Appendix A notes appear in English), and as such we believe "de Woodchurch" is a plausibly period byname.

SENA Appendix A notes both double given name and double bynames are permitted for late period English.

Rosie Black Rune (Dreiburgen) – New Device. Purpure, on a bezant a rose purpure and a chief per pale Or and sable.
