It turns out that Jorgen is a High German variant of George. (<http://dmnes.org/name/George>). I presume it enters Danish via that route. (The medieval Swedish and Low German version is Jurgen).

So yeah, we can probably construct a Medieval Danish "Dagmund" to go with "Jorgensen" if the submitter is okay with that. Alternatively, if the submitter wants a Viking-age name, maybe point him at <http://www.vikinganswerlady.com/ONMensNames.shtml#j> for something that sounds like Jorgen?

Jan, 4 instances of Janko, and 1 of Ianko. As per SENA Appendix A, Polish-language bynames include the feminine, unmarried suffix -ówna, hence the name Jankowna.
