

***Minutes of the Nov 12, 2017 Meeting***

**1: Astrid skalphæna - Resub Badge (*Fieldless*) *A talbot couchant argent marked sable, vested gules***

This badge was returned on the July 2017 LOAR for conflict with Finn Silverfox, Vert, chausse chequy argent and sable, a fox dormant argent. There is one DC for the field, with making the vestment more than 50% of the Talbot this should give the second DC.

Forwarded as submitted.

**2: Cesar Alejandro de Baracoa - Resub Device *Sable, in saltire a fish skeleton and a cutlass inverted argent, a bordure argent semy of death's heads gules***

needs redraw of the sword due to jagged edge. Death heads were redrawn by submitter. Forwarded as redrawn once approved by submitter.

### 3: Erik langhár - New Name

**Erik** Found in Old Danish as Erik, Old Swedish Erik, OW.Norse Eiríkr. Scholars are not certain what the derivation of the first element of this name is, but may come from the first element Ei- or Ein- (see above), or alternately may derive from the form \*aiwa, "always." For the second element -ríkr or -rekr see above. This name is very common throughout Scandinavia from the earliest times.<http://vikinganswerlady.com/ONMensNames.shtml#e>

### 4: Grisell Paintare - New Name & New Device *Azure, a sheaf of artist's paintbrushes argent*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

Meaning (unspecified) most important.

The submitter is interested in a feminine name and allows all changes. If the name must be changed she cares most about the meaning (unspecified).

Both name elements are documented from "Index of Scots names found in Dictionary of the Older Scottish Tongue" by Sara L. Uckelman (<http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/scots/dost/>). Grisell is found as a feminine given name in this spelling in 1584 (header buth-). Paintare is a surname found in this spelling in 1543 (header commendatar).

The submitter allows the creation of a holding name if necessary.

### 5: Gyldenholt, Barony of - New Badge Change *Azure, a hurst and in chief two swords in chevron Or*

- **Azure, a tree Or, in chief two swords in chevron proper.**

## **6: Marcellus Drachenklaue - New Household Name joint with Alesone House of the Tyger and Lily**

**This submission is to be associated with Alesone Gray of Cranlegh  
No major changes.**

This follows the pattern of an Inn sign of two heraldic charges, joined by the word "and" as documented in "Dictionary of Inn-Sign Names in medieval and Renaissance England" by Juliana de Luna <http://heraldry.sca.org/kwhss/2017/inn%20signs%20dictionary%20JdL.pdf>

Tyger and lily are both heraldic charges found in the Pictorial Dictionary of Heraldry:

Note: The submitter would like House of the Tyger and Lily. However, the submitter would be willing to drop "the" if it is necessary for registration.

Associated with the joint badge on the Caid Sept 30 letter (Fieldless) A tyger sejant erect contourny purpure sustaining a fleur-de-lys sablelis sable

Tyger:Itm, a stonyng gilt cup, couered, chaced wt a Tyger in the botom, of the gifte of master Tego, weying. Lily:(a1398) \* Trev. Barth.(Add 27944) 232a/a: Pe roote of þe lilie haþ many cloues as the roote of garleke..þe stalk of þe lily haþ many knottis. [Source: Middle English Dictionary]

**7: Simon Maxwell - New Device *Per bend sinister azure and argent, a wolf rampant argent charged on the heart with a thistle sable, and a panther sinister rampant sable charged on the heart with a thistle argent***

this is a kingdom resub because the emblazon did not match the blazon. Contacted submitter and blazon correct so emblazon is being recolored

**8: Teleri Garðarsdóttir - New Badge (*Fieldless*) on a flask Or, a slug sable**

this is a kingdom resub from last month returned because the slug was in trian aspect. This drawing corrects the issue

**9: Thomas Fitz Gerald - New Name & New Device *Or, issuant from the flanks two demi-cogwheels sable***

No preferences are indicated.

Both name elements are documented from "Names Found in Anglicized Irish Documents: Men's Names" by Mari ingen Briain meic Donnchada (<http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnglicizedIrish/Masculine.shtml>)

Thomas is a masculine given name found 47 times in this spelling from 1528 to 1639. Fitz Gerald is found as a surname in this spelling in 1599 including Tho. Fitz Gerald fitz James.

The submitter allows the creation of a holding name if necessary.

This is a period charge found in Grand Equestrian Roll of the Order of the Toison d'Or c. 1450. Bruce will add the image in commentary.

The motif of demi-cogwheels issuant from the flanks is taken from the Grand Equestrian Roll of the Order of the Golden Fleece, mid-15th C., fol.20. Pastoureau and Popoff, editors of the 2001 release, ascribe the arms to von Königsberg.

This is clear of the device of Padruig Dubhchlogad (reg. August 1991 via Meridies), Or, a candle gules between two flaunches embattled sable, by removal of the primary charge.

**10: Úlfr Ívarsson - New Name & New Device *Checky sable and argent, a sea-wolf erect gules.***

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No changes.

Sound (unspecified) most important.

Language (unspecified) most important.

Culture (unspecified) most important.

Meaning (unspecified) most important.

The submitter desires a masculine name and allows no changes. If the name must be changed he cares most about meaning, sound, and language and/or culture, all unspecified.

Both name elements are documented from "Viking Names found in Landnámabók" by Aryanhwy merch Catmael (<http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/norse/landnamabok.html>). Úlfr is a masculine given name found 21 times. Ívarr is found 4 or 5 times. The patronymic is formed per Geirr Bassi p. 17.

He allows the creation of a holding name if necessary.

While sea-monsters are erect by default, the submitted blazon echoes that of his father's device. Permission to conflict with his father's device is included:

I, <legal name>, known in the SCA as Ivar Krigsvin, give <legal name>, known in the SCA as Úlfr Ívarsson, for his armory Checky sable and argent, a sea-wolf erect gules, to look similar to but not identical, to my armory, Checky sable and argent, a sea-lion erect gules. I understand that this permission cannot be withdrawn once Úlfr's armory is registered.

The PtC is signed with Ivar's legal name and dated 10/28/17.
